



In January 2019 Mary's Mercy Center through its Mary's Table and Mary's Children provided the following services;

Meals served: 6017 (includes lunches for parolees)

Food Bags: 564 (over 4 Wednesdays)
Showers (including a change of clothes): 401
Hygiene kits: 364 plus 162 shaving kits

Hair Cuts: 17

Clothing (2-4 outfits and shoes): 186 of which 161 were for extreme emergencies.

Thursday Giveaway: 475 individuals & families

Children's Program: **28 families' needs were met.** We were able to help these families with a crib, two bassinets, four strollers, six car seats, 16 baby blankets and over 300 pounds of clothes.

We were also able to help families with two twin beds with mattresses, a dresser, an end table and a microwave. Did you notice? Thanks to your generosity we have expanded our Thursday giveaway to include Tuesdays!
