In February 2019 Mary's Mercy Center through its Mary's Table and Mary's Children provided the following services;

Meals served: 5,713 (includes lunches for parolees)

Food Bags: 452 (over 3 Wednesdays)
Showers (including a change of clothes): 340
Hygiene kits: 146 plus 127 shaving kits

Hair Cuts: 13

Clothing (2-4 outfits and shoes): 167 of which 156 were for extreme emergencies.

Thursday Giveaway: 300 individuals & families Children's Program: 23 families' needs were met.

We were also able to help families with 4 car seats, 12 baby blankets, 90 pounds of baby clothes and two boxes of children's toys. We were also able to help some of our handicapped guests with 1 wheel-chair and 3 senior canes.
